It will house all health programs except the dental program. He also stated that the college will be building residences at Interurban after the new building is complete, which is slated for 2019. Camosun itself must raise 5 million dollars towards the new building. The new space will have 10 times the student space as any of the current buildings and there will be an Indigenous peoples healing centre. Some programs will be relocated from Interurban to Lansdowne to make space for the influx of Health Sciences students. John opened the floor to questions.
