III Presentations/Resignations/Guest Business/Announcements

- a) Academic Success Centre- Chrisa Hotchkiss started with a video called "jerks" Cat's stealing dogs' beds and talked about some stress reliving methods such as humor and visualization. Next she had the group shut their eyes and using their imagination taking them to a warm sandy beach sitting in a lounge chair, feeling the gentle breeze and feeling the suns warmth. Getting the group to completely relax. These are methods used to ease the anxiety of writing exams or doing presentations. She went on to explain that stress is associated with certain activities and places. Positive thoughts are very strong and can help with coping with stressful situations. The last video we watched was on cross laterals and building brain connections. She also showed us the learning skills guides she put together. She then took questions and feedback. The feedback is positive.
- b) Feminine Hygiene Drive for Homeless Women-Kelsey Wolley gave a presentation on her campaign to raise awareness over homeless feminine hygiene in Victoria. She is working with WIN and she is trying to get folks to do a hot sauce shot challenge much like the "Ice Bucket Challenge". Folks would be encouraged to do a shot of hot sauce and then folks would donate to get them to do so. Kelsey is a Camosun Student who has launched this in co-ordination with Women in Need. Kelsey asked for \$400 in support. Wyatt made a motion for \$500 in support.
- c) Indigenous Men's Wellness Group—Ren Louie, Peter Charlie from the Indigenous Men's Wellness Group started with a traditional song and introduced themselves in their native tongue. They went on to explain the purpose and need of the Men's Wellness Group and some of the work the group has done in the past and the need for continued work in the future. The funding obtained from the CCSS & FNSA will be used to help the group to learn traditional hunting methods and obtain a Personal Acquisition License as well as watch a hockey game and have an elder's dinner.
