IV Financial Motions/Issues

a) Adding CCSS staff member Tagg Kelt as a CCSS credit card holder-Michel explained that the CCSS has a credit account with TD bank and that account is currently linked to two credit cards one in Michel's possession and the other in Christine's possession. Matthew added that the CCSS needs to first apply for a credit increase to \$40,000.00 (It is currently \$20,000) In Tagg's role as Clubs and Events Coordinator he has been making purchases for the CCSS on his personal credit card which impacts his ability to use his personal credit card for the things he needs. Matthew also stated that hey has been making purchases on his personal credit card and it would be smart if he was also added as a card holder.
