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a) Executive Director's Report-Michel reported that he is been going to a lot of basketball games lately since the CCSS sponsored the PAC West basketball tournament this past Thursday Friday and Saturday. He also mentioned that the Camosun volleyball teams, both men's and women's won gold at the College of the Rockies. b) WUSC student refugee funding sustainability and potential fee increase-Michel explained that the CCSS has been sponsoring refugee students for some time, last August the CCSS received its 8th refugee student. Over the years the cost of this program has gone up exponentially and due to rising costs he suggests the CCSS run a referendum in the upcoming Spring 2023 CCSS election to ask students for more funding for this program. Michael Glover noted that this program currently strains all other programs that the CCSS runs for students and suggested that in the referendum we ask students for \$1.25 per month.

Whereas the Camosun College Student Society has sponsored student a refugee through World Universities Services Canada's Student Refugee Program for the last 8 years; and

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Whereas during the last 8 years, the costs of the sponsorship have increased much higher than the rate of inflation due to skyrocketing costs of rent, food, combined with that additional support being required for refugees who require more than a year of upgrading before being able to take regular credit programs; and

Whereas the Camosun College Student Society is currently using other student funds to subsidise the Student Refugee Program and this is now becoming unsustainable; therefore

BIRT the CCSS Board of Directors hold a referendum during the upcoming elections asking students to increase the Student Refugee Fee from the current 50 cents per month to \$1.00 per month commencing Fall 2023.

MOTION TO AMEND Singh/Love

BIRT the CCSS Board of Directors hold a referendum in the upcoming elections asking students to increase the Student Refugee Fee from the current \$0.50 per month to \$1.25 per month commencing fall 2023. With the goal of 25% going to increasing or offsetting staffing costs. AMMENDMENT CARRIED
