VII Other Reports

a) Executive Director's report- **Michel** states that the college is facing bloody times with multi-million-dollar deficits. The college is making moves to reduce expenditure via restructuring. They state that they are only making administrative cuts and aren't reducing courses or programs. This will undoubtedly change if the deficit increases. Canada's inability to attract international students due to post-graduate work permit regulations means the international students will not be replenished once our current cohort graduates. Very little information was provided in the latest town hall, and staff did not receive it well.

The *Nexus* proposal will be in the next agenda and will be distributed by **Michel** this week.

Matthew asked about the political climate regarding the 2% tuition cap and other unions pushing for that to be raised. **Michel** states that that is his nightmare scenario. A BCFS meeting is being held to figure out how to address this issue. Without the cap, we would enter very dark times, and we cannot allow this to come down on students' shoulders. If tuitions begin to rise, we are going to lose more students due to financial inaccessibility.
